

Faecal Egg Count (FEC) – Horse Data Sheet

IMPORTANT: in order to obtain the most meaningful test result, EBW suggests a faecal egg count (FEC) NOT be undertaken within the stated product efficacy period of a deworming treatment as this may affect the result. Unless you have concerns your horse may harbour resistant worms, it is recommended you obtain a FEC just prior to your next planned deworming treatment – you may find you will not have to treat your horse at all.
